Dear Mr. Eben,

I am writing to express CleanTECH San Diego's support for the Shu'luuk Wind Project proposed on the reservation of the Campo Band of Mission Indians of the Kumeyaay Nation in eastern San Diego County. This project is an important part of positioning the San Diego region as a global leader in the cleantech economy.

CleanTECH San Diego is a nonprofit association focused on accelerating the greater San Diego region's transition to a clean energy economy. We have a broad and diverse membership that includes private sector companies, local governments, nongovernmental agencies and universities and research institutions.

Shu'luuk Wind provides an important opportunity for the Campo Band to diversify its economy and generate additional revenue which will enable the Tribe to provide expanded programs and services for the Campo people.

Development of Shu'luuk Wind will create jobs in the construction and operation and maintenance of the wind farm, as well as ancillary jobs that support the wind facility. By creating clean jobs, the project will help boost the local economy and support the growing cleantech industry in the greater San Diego region.

Shu'luuk Wind plays an integral role in helping the San Diego region meet ambitious state mandates for the generation of 33% renewable energy by 2020. The project will generate clean power for approximately 40,000 homes and will reinforce the Campo Band's leadership as the largest producer of clean, renewable wind energy on Indian lands in the United States.

As the Bureau of Indian Affairs considers the merits and impacts of Shu'luuk Wind, CleanTECH San Diego encourages you to consider the economic and environmental benefits that the project will bring to the Campo Tribe and the San Diego region as a whole.
